HOW OLD IS TOO OLD??

I couldn't help but notice the book clear out from all your personal libraries everyone made for the February auction. I look at my own collection of books and the one thing I can't do is part with any of them. Yes, some are rather old, but how old is "old" or better put, too old to keep? Just last week LInda White and I were looking at some old books when she pointed out a book "Scrappy Duos" by Donna Thomas who uses 2 different quilt blocks for her quilt tops. What makes it stand out is that she has "colour recipes" for the blocks - it's

foolproof and what's more is that the colour planning has all been done for you. It was written in 2000; to me that feels like yesterday but really, it's 18 years old. That's old. But, is it too old to keep on in the library? You bet it is. Especially when it's new to me because I've never approached blocks in this manner and it was new to me. All I'd have to do is put in modern fabrics and voila I've created something new from an old yet very valid technique.

Don't judge a book by its date but rather by what information it has.

NEW in the Library are these books:

A Quilter's Mixology, Angela Pingel. Discover an introduction to curved piecing via one simple block: Drunkard's Path. It's a very old pattern yes, but here it is for you to try again with new designs.

Savour Each Stitch, Carolyn Friedlander. No doubt this is modern take on design but Carolyn teaches us Line, contrast, scale, Color, emphasis, volume and texture using a spontaneous approach. It's fun, new and you'll learn something.



CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE OXFORD QUILTERS GUILD

ARTICLES 1 - NAME

The organization shall be known as the "Oxford Quilters' Guild".

ARTICLES 2 - AIM & OBJECTIVES

The Oxford Quilters' Guild is a non-profit organization whose objectives are:

To promote an appreciation for and to contribute to the knowledge of the art and craftsmanship associated with quilting, patchwork and fibre arts.

To encourage performance in the craft by providing educational opportunities and a forum for fellowship and exchange of experience, information and ideas.

To encourage high stands of colour, design and technique in quilting, patchwork and fibre arts.

ARTICLES 3 – MEMBERSHIP

Regular membership shall be open to all those interested in quilting, patchwork and fibre arts whether quilt lover or quiltmaker, beginner or experienced, amateur or professional, upon payment of annual dues.

Visitors may attend one meeting or activity of the Guild as specified by the Executive Committee.

Honourary membership may be awarded on the recommendation of the Executive Committee and approval of the general membership.

Membership shall be capped at 250 members with existing members having the first rights of renewal. Henceforth a waiting list shall be established.

ARTICLE 4 - MEMBERSHIP DUES

The Oxford Quilters Guild is part of the Ingersoll Creative Arts Centre. Annual dues as determined annually by the Executive Committee shall be paid by all regular members and will include membership in the Ingersoll Creative Arts Centre. Membership in the Ingersoll Creative Arts Centre is required at a cost to be determined by the said Centre. The membership years shall be June 1 to May 31. Visitor's fees shall be determined by the Executive Committee as appropriate to specified activities.

ARTICLE 5 - DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

President: Shall preside at one meeting of the Guild each month and all meetings of the Executive Committee. Shall be the Chief Administrative Officer of the Guild at its annual meeting. Duties include calling Executive meetings, setting executive meeting agendas, and developing the Guild Monthly Meeting Agendas. The president should serve as an advocate for the membership. Shall be an ex official member of all committees except the Nominating Committee.

Vice-President: In the absence of the President, the Vice-President shall serve in the order of office and shall perform such duties as are performed by the President. Shall become cognizant of Guild operations and policies (apprenticeship). Shall be responsible for planning a Program on special activities designed to further the objectives of the Guild.

all records as necessary to the annual audit and prepare such reports as are required.

Past President: Shall be available for consultation. May attend Executive meetings. Shall chair the Nominating Committee.

Membership Convenor: Shall annually organize membership registrations, renewals and collection of dues. Shall track changes and additions to the membership list throughout the year and provide an accurate list to the executive using either an e-mail or a drop-box file..

Social Convenor: Should annually plan and organize banquet at the general meeting of the Guild in June. Shall plan refreshments for monthly meetings as requested.

Program Convenor: Shall be responsible for planning a program on monthly activities designed to further the objectives of the Guild.

Publicity Convenor: Shall be responsible for all advertising and press releases and communicating with the news media. Shall notify other guilds of our upcoming events, and perform any other duties deemed necessary by the Executive Committee members.

Evening/Day Co-Ordinator: Shall preside at one meeting of the Guild each month. Shall attend all Executive meetings.

Workshop Co-Ordinator: Shall be responsible for instructional workshops presented on an occasional basis for the membership. Shall be responsible for research, contact, and liaison with prospective workshop instructors and report the findings to the Executive. Cost of Workshops shall be determined by Executive consensus.

Librarian: Shall maintain a current list of library resources. Shall order new books etc. and maintain appropriate subscriptions. Shall catalogue new library material and prepare it for distribution. Shall prepare reviews of new material for meetings and newsletters. Shall manage the operation of the library during meetings. Shall inventory library holdings once per year.

Dispatch Editor: Shall be responsible for sending of the Newsletter five (05) times each guild year. ie: mailing in mid-August and two weeks before guild meetings in October, December, February and April. Information to be published is to be gathered at meetings prior to publication. Shall collect relevant information from various committees and Executive meetings. Shall search for and publish information about up-coming events of interest to members.

Website Co-Ordinator: Shall be responsible for the structure and content of the guild website. Shall be responsible for set-up and maintenance of the web-site. Shall use membership email list to send notification to members of upcoming events, guild business reminders, etc

Social Media Administrator: Maintains and updates the OQG Facebook page, uploads events, pictures of events, etc... to keep membership apprised of Guild activities and to build social media connections with our members and with the public at large.

Oxford Quilters Guild Rep for ICAC Executive Board: Attends meetings of Oxford Quilt Guild and the ICAC Board and acts as a Liaison between the two groups. Prepares a monthly report for the Board to be submitted and circulated one week prior to the monthly meeting. Inform the Board of any concerns, issues, events that the Guild may have so they can be dealt with in a timely fashion. Prepares a year-end report to be presented at the ICAC AGM.

ARTICLE 7 – COMMITTEES

Executive committee: Shall consist of the officers of the Guild and chairpersons of committees. Each members shall have a vote. Shall meet at least eight (8) times a year at the call of the President. Additional meetings may be called as necessary by the President or at the request of two members. A quorum

shall be five (5) members of the Executive Committee. May appoint committees as necessary to further the objectives of the Guild. Shall hold joint meetings with the newly elected Executive Committee following the annual meeting for the purposes of orientation at the time.

Nominating Committee: Shall be chaired by the Past-President and shall be comprised of the Vice-President and two members of the Guild. Shall prepare a slate of officers for submission to the Executive Committee prior to May 01. The slate of officers shall be circulated to the membership at the annual meeting. If a position is contested a vote shall be conducted by ballot. Ad Hoc committees may be appointed as necessary by the Executive.

ARTICLE 8 - MEETINGS

The annual meeting of the Guild shall be held in June. Notice of the meeting shall be circulated in the Newsletter prior to the meeting. The number of regular meetings shall be determined by the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE 9 – AUDIT

The accounts of the Guild shall be audited annually by audit committee approved at the annual meeting. The fiscal year shall be June 1 to May 31.

ARTICLE 10 – SIGNING AUTHORITY

The signing authority for the Guild for all cheques and documents shall be any two of the following: Secretary, Treasurer, President or Vice-President.

ARTICLES 11 – AMENDMENT OF CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

The Constitution may be amended or repealed by a two-thirds majority vote of members present at the annual meeting of the guild. Notice of amendment or repeal must be circulated to the members thirty (30) days prior to the annual meeting at which it is to be presented. Any such amendment or repeal shall be effective immediately following the approval.

ARTICLE 12 – PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE

In all matters not provided for in this Constitution and By-laws, Roberts Rules of Order revised shall be the parliamentary authority.

Adopted by motion:
