Make sure you check this one out!




Bella, Bella Quilts by Norah McMeeking

Are you the type of person that takes pictures of things because you think what you see would make a great pattern for a quilt?? I will often see things and take the picture just because I like the colours or shapes, as the pics from my trip to France below show. (Don't worry this was in 2019.)









You don't need to travel to find these types of images to inspire you, and if you can't get out at all look around your own home and focus on the things you have in front of you everyday. If creating your own pattern is not your thing but like the idea of taking aspects of architecture and using it in a quilt, then check out this book by Norah McMeeking. Bella, Bella Quilts uses the designs of Italian Mosaics as inspiration for some fantastic quilt designs. This book features beautiful circles within circles, mandala styles, and using familiar quilting shapes into new combinations. It also has full-sized paper-piecing patterns for you to photocopy and use when creating these beautiful designs.
